2	 <u>P-2015-012</u> Andrew and Katherine Felis 1009 Church Street (South side of Church Street, 170'± East of Chatham Street) Remove 21" DBH Live Oak Tree located in the Church Street right-of-way, located in the Oakleigh Garden District. The Vice-Chair announced the application had been recommended to allow selective root pruning and not removal. He added if anyone wished to speak on the matter they should do so at that time.
	No one was in attendance to present the application.
	There was discussion about the recommendation and root pruning versus removal as requested. It was noted that root pruning is not often recommended or approved. It was also noted that the tree appears to be in good health, and that the canopy had recently been pruned by Forestry.
	There was a question about the video referenced in the staff report. Staff stated that the video had not been submitted.
	A motion was made and seconded to Deny the application.
	The motion carried unanimously.

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OTHER BUSINESS

• Mr Olsen discussed changing from issuing a "Letter of Permit" to an Actual permit form, similar to those issued for building permits and zoning certificates, and the reasons behind such a change. Mr Olsen provided a sample of what the permit might look like.

The Commission supported the idea, and then discussed items such as the font, who would issue the permits, and how detailed the information would/could be. Mr Olsen indicated that he would provide an amended sample at a future meeting.

Ideas from the past included: presenting the award at Arbor Day, during Tree Commission meetings and during the City Council Meetings.
