ANALYSIS an existing live oak located within t	The applicant is requesting approval to trim a large limb on the city's right of way. The applicant states that their roof is



The request is recommend for approval by Urban Forestry in compliance with ANSI A300 pruning standards. Further, as required by the Zoning Ordinance, the tree trimming permit may only be issued to a certified

arborist who is licensed and bonded to work in the City of Mobile, with all work to be coordinated with Urban Forestry.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Based on the preceding, this request for removal is recommended for APPROVAL subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Tree trimming permit be issued to a certified arborist who is licensed and bonded to work in the City of Mobile; and
- 2. All trimming to be coordinated with Urban Forestry, in compliance with ANSI A300 pruning standards.
