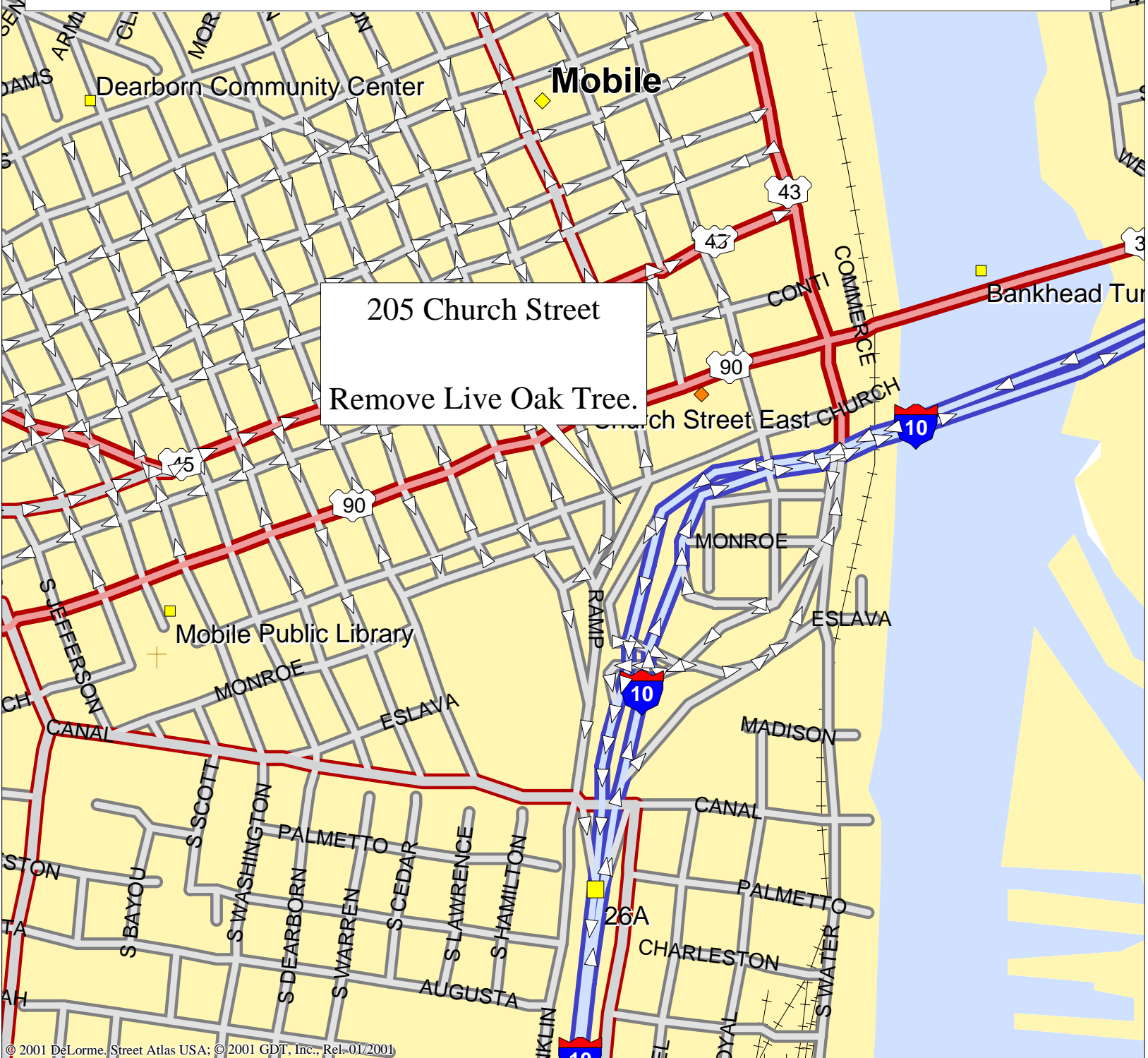

**SITUATION: Applicant is requesting to remove two of the four existing Live Oak Trees to allow more room for the two remaining trees to grow.**

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends denial since all four trees are healthy, and thinning is not a justification to remove a healthy urban tree.**
