Use, Access, and Tree Planting Variances to allow an automotive repair shop in a B-2, Neighborhood Business District, with no direct vehicular public street access to the parking area, and reduced tree plantings; the Zoning Ordinance requires a B-3, Community Business District for an automotive repair shop, direct vehicular access to a public street from the parking area, eight frontage trees, thirty perimeter trees, and two parking trees.

Dear Applicant/Property Owner:

On June 4, 2012, the Board of Zoning Adjustment denied the variance of **the Tree Planting Variance**; however, the Board approved the Use & Access variance, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. compliance with the Tree Planting requirements and that the placement of the frontage trees be approved by Traffic Engineering and Urban Forestry; and.
- 2. compliance with all other municipal codes and ordinances.

Any party aggrieved by this decision may, within fifteen days of the date of the decision, appeal to the Circuit Court of Mobile County by filing a written notice of appeal, specifying the decision from which the appeal is taken. Notice of the appeal, as well as a date stamped copy of the appeal filed in Circuit Court must be filed with this Board within the fifteen-day appeal period.

No permit, license or certification can be issued until the 15-day appeal period has expired and no appeal has been made. If a permit/license has not been obtained on or
